

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The following requirements must be met unless a variance is granted. Any variance granted must be attached.

Debris Management Deadline for this event is 90 days from date of application.

Check all that apply:

The site is located above the 100 - year floodplain and outside of known wetlands. (The floodplain map used for locating the site shall be an original Flood Insurance Rate Map prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, a copy of the Flood Prone Area Map prepared by the US Geological Survey, or an equivalently constructed map that depicts the limits and elevations of any 100-year floodplain on or adjacent to the proposed site). Exemption required

The site is located at least 1/4 mile from a public or private water supply (surface or ground). If the site will be used only for the stockpiling, burning, chipping or burial of tree limbs and brush, the distance may be reduced from 1/4 mile to 300 feet.

NA If the site will receive any putrescible waste that may attract birds, it must be located at least 5,000 feet (1,524 meters) from any airport runway used only by piston engine aircraft, or within 10,000 feet (3,048 meters) of any airport runway used by turbojet aircraft, except as may be approved by the US Federal Aviation Administration.

Provisions are in place to ensure that hazardous waste, radioactive waste, regulated polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB waste) or regulated infectious wastes are excluded.

Public official understands that the burial site must be properly closed and covered with 3 feet of soil within 90 days.

All burning of solid waste will be located at least 500 feet (preferably 1/2 mile) from an occupied residence and in accordance with all local and county ordinances including burn bans.

Provisions are in place to exclude the burning of rubber, plastics, asbestos, upholstery, carpeting and other similar materials that produce unreasonable amounts of air contaminants.

Public official understands that burning must be controlled so that the smoke does not create a traffic hazard.

NA Open burning in counties with a population >500,000 (Oklahoma and Tulsa counties), shall be conducted using an air curtain incinerator in areas that (1) are or have been designated non-attainment for National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) or where the Department-certified ambient air quality monitoring data documents a violation of primary NAAQS prior to such determination.

Public Official understands that the burial site must allow a minimum of 15 feet of separation from groundwater.

Is not located in or adjacent to a known cemetery.

Discovery Clause -- In the event that archaeological deposits (soils, features, artifacts, other remnants of human activity) are uncovered in urban or rural areas, or if archaeological deposits are found in tree root balls during removal, the project shall be halted and the applicant shall stop all work immediately in the vicinity of the discovery and take reasonable measures to avoid or minimize harm to the finds. The applicant will inform OEM immediately, will secure all archaeological findings and restrict access to the area. OEM shall notify FEMA and FEMA will consult with SHPO or THPO or Tribal representatives. Work in sensitive areas cannot resume until consultations are completed or until an archaeologist who meets SOI Professional Qualifications determines the extent of the discovery. Work may not resume at or around the delineated archaeological deposit until the applicant is notified by OEM. In the event that an unmarked grave, indications of burial or human remains are present, compliance with the Oklahoma Burial Law (Title 21.1168.4) is required. The applicant will immediately stop all work, secure all the findings, restrict access to the area and call local law enforcement officials and OEM. OEM shall notify FEMA and FEMA will consult with law enforcement officials, and SHPO or THPO or Tribal representatives if the remains are Native American. Work cannot resume at or near the site until the Applicant is notified by OEM.
